Section 30(c) – substantial prejudice to the effective conduct of public affairs

An exemption under section 30(c) of FOISA (prejudice to effective conduct of public affairs) applies to some of the information requested. It is essential to be able to communicate, often in confidence, with external stakeholders on a range of issues, including future planning. Disclosing particularly without the consent of the stakeholder, is likely to undermine type of issue in the future. These stakeholders will be reluctant to their views fully and frankly if they believe that their views are likely to be made public, particularly while these discussions are still ongoing and decisions have not been taken, This would significantly harm the Government's ability to carry out many aspects of its work, and could adversely affect its ability to gather all of the evidence it needs to make fully informed decisions.
