

Adult Disability Payment for people who are terminally ill

Adult Disability Payment will provide someone with financial support if they have been diagnosed with a terminal illness.

It is available to people aged between 16 and state pension age. They can apply no matter how long ago they were diagnosed or their life expectancy.

How to apply

All we need is:

- · a shortened Adult Disability Payment application form that asks only for basic information
- confirmation of the terminal diagnosis from a registered doctor or nurse involved in the care or diagnosis of the terminally ill person

The form the doctor or nurse should complete and return to us is the Benefits Assessment under Special Rules (BASRiS) form. The BASRiS is used by doctors and nurses to confirm someone is terminally ill, allowing us to fast-track their application.

The terminally ill person can request the form from them, or we can request it on their behalf. If they have already completed a DS1500 or SR1 form, we will accept that.

When we receive an application

Once an application is successfully completed:

- they will automatically get the highest award for daily living and mobility
- the award will be ongoing without needing a review
- the award will be calculated from the date we receive their application or the date the BASRIS form says they were diagnosed, whichever is earliest.

Payments are made weekly in advance.

How long will this take?

An application will be fast-tracked and dealt with by our specially-trained staff. We will send a letter with our decision.

Getting a second opinion on a diagnosis

Someone can seek a second opinion if they disagree with the clinical opinion. They can find out more about the Charter of Patients' Rights and Responsibilities by going to gov.scot and searching for patients' rights.



Can someone apply for any related benefits?
